This Week with Mrs. Kelly

Just a few more weeks of SEL! K Prep played a fun game to review feelings.
Kindergarten practiced "Fair Ways to Play." Grade 1 learned how to use the STEP framework to handle name-calling and teasing. We also reviewed how to be assertive. Grade 2 worked on taking responsibility for actions. We practiced saying:

1) "I'm sorry," 2) "Are you okay?" and 3) "What can I do to make it better?" Grades 3 & 4 worked on handling disagreements using STEP and avoiding "blaming" words.

Grade 5 celebrated with some fun games that grow their working memory and impulse control. Grade 6 worked in small groups preparing for their trip to Villa Marie on Tuesday. They also wrote very insightful letters to the incoming 6th grade with advice on how to make the Villa visits successful next year.






