2. **Pastor/Principal Reports/Comments – Mrs Scaramucci Restructuring: It has been 6 months so far. Fr. Jim has been in a lot of meetings, and every Parish is going to be affected. The schools will not see as big of an impact. The listening sessions for St. Edith will be in June. There will be two of them and they will be the same- you do not need to attend both. There is also a written survey you can fill out for input you are unable to attend the listening session. Between January and March of 2027, all the changes will be announced. This will give time for the changes to be implemented. Changes will officially happen in July of 2027. If a school is closing, it is a parish and school decision. St Edith has about 1200 people at Mass per weekend. St. Edith was 1 of 11 schools at the Catholic Schools Fair. We ran out of folders. Jackie and Mrs. Scaramucci talked with a lot of interested families. Tours have been scheduled every day and there will be many kids shadowing in the coming days and weeks. Numbers are looking very good for next year. Incoming 1st grade: probably set for next year as it is a full class. Incoming 5th grade: there may be a couple more spots left. Drama Club: Mrs. Scaramucci has a meeting on Friday with the ladies who ran the club at St. Vals. 25 of the 80 students who attend St. Vals are in drama club. Their drama club is for grades 3-8, they meet after school and put on 2 shows a year. A lot of St. Vals parents are torn between us and St. Mikes. Plymouth Library Preschool Parade: not successful. Everyone was there for a Montessori preschool in Plymouth. The Livonia Preschool Parade is coming up at the end of the month. We are hoping this one is more fruitful. Westland and Farmington Hills do not have anything like this. Numbers for next year: Preschool 3's: 5, Preschool 4's: 18, K Prep: 13, Kindergarten: 18. Incoming 6, 7, 8 grades will have an influx of students. Many are from St. Vals. March is reading month: committee meeting this week. Officer Stephanie and Mrs. S looking at moving lunch to the school side of the building due to safety and security. Bishop Monforton will be here March 25 for Mass.**

Next time we have this event: idea of a separate raffle for pews for kinder graduation, sacraments, etc. The Mother Son event is the same day as CYO St. Patrick's party. The Mother Son event will be Mother Son Olympics and will take place earlier in the day.
