Uniform Reminders

Everyone is growing, and with that comes shorter skirts. Remember that skirts should not be rolled and no more than a couple of inches above the knee. If you are in need of a longer skirt, we have a few available for consignment.

Leggings under skirts should be solid black or solid blue, not gray. The leg should be tapered (no flare).

Grades 3-8 should be wearing a belt with pants. Pants should be cotton material, not performance or joggers.

K-4 girls must wear jumpers next year. The exception is for add-to-uniform Fridays where K-4 girls can wear skirts with a St. Edith shirt.

Light blue polos will no longer be permitted for the 2025-26 school year.

This Week with Mrs. Kelly

Dr. Tim Hogan is conducting our Family of Parishes Lenten Mission based on a book that he wrote in 2021: The Gift of Cultural Hurricanes: Tools to Rebuild Authentic Spirituality. While acknowledging that technology has brought a lot of benefits, one of his key points is that technology has made it harder to connect with each other and with God. He gives some practical tips on how to re-establish that connection. Here's 3 for families: 1) Try to eat dinners together. Children learn a lot of social skills at the table. 2) Enjoy device free dinners. Or if going cold turkey is too hard, start with making one meal a week device free. 3) Practice gratitude. At mealtime or bedtime, ask family members to share what they are grateful for that day, "the small moments of delight" in nature and life. Feeling thankful can improve sleep, mood, and spirituality.


