Reminders

<u>Lunch orders for September are due Tuesday, August 26th.</u>

Lunch reminders: This is a reminder that there are no refunds for absences or field trip days. If you order on a field trip day, we cannot save the lunch. This is due to food safety regulations. Please make sure not to order on field trip days. We are doing our best to plan out field trips with enough notice to block off days on FACTS. The only lunch refund is for snow days/days when school is cancelled.

Field trip reminders: No siblings and no stops are permitted for any reason on field trips. Failure to adhere to this will be a loss of field trip chaperoning privileges.

All students must be in at least a booster seat unless they are eight years old or over 4'9". This means for any field trip for first grade and under (and many of the second graders) must be in a booster seat for field trips. Please make sure that, if you are not chaperoning a field trip, your student comes in that day with a booster seat.



Vaccines Required for School Entry in Michigan

Whenever children arein group settings, there is a chancefordisease tospread. Parents must follow state vaccine laws inorder for their children to attend school. These laws are the minimum standard for preventing disease outbreaks in group settings. The best way to protect children from serious diseases is to follow the recommended vaccination schedule at www.cdc.gov/Vaccines. When following the recommended schedule children are fully protected and any school vaccination requirements are met.

Meningococcal Conjugate (MenACWY)1	None	1 dose at 11 years of age or older upon entry into 7th grade or higher
Varicella (Chickenpox)1, 2	2 doses at or after 12 months of age or current lab immunity or history of varicella disease ges and at certain times (follow CDC Immunization Schedule for the recommended number of doses, correct spacing, and ages); this chart is based on Michigan school immunization	

Avaccines should be given at certain ages and at certain times (follow CDC Immunization Schedule for the recommended number of doses, correct spacing, and ages); this chart is based on Michigan school immunization requirements. We strongly encourage parents and providers to follow the CDC recommended schedule because school requirements are the minimum for protection. Follow this chart when assessing immunization status for school immunization requirements. If the child has not received these vaccines, documented immunity/waiver is required. During disease outbreaks, incompletely vaccinated children may be excluded from school. Parents and guardians choosing to decline vaccines must obtain a certified non-medical waiver from a local health department. Read more about waivers at www.michigan.gov/immunize. The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) does not discriminate against any individual or group on the basis of race, national origin, color, sex, disability, religion, age, height, weight, familial status, partisan considerations, or genetic information. Sex-based discrimination includes, but is not limited to, discrimination based on sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, sex characteristics, and pregnancy.
