Afterwards, we reflected on what worked well and what could work better next time. 3rd grade learned how to make a good plan and how it can help with learning and remembering. Kindergarten continued the unit on feelings and practiced handling big emotions by using the "Calm Down Steps" which are: 1) Say "Stop"; 2) Name your feeling; 3) Use a calm down skill like belly breathing, counting or positive self-talk. 6th grade practiced being flexible as they changed up groups for their visit to Villa Marie next week. 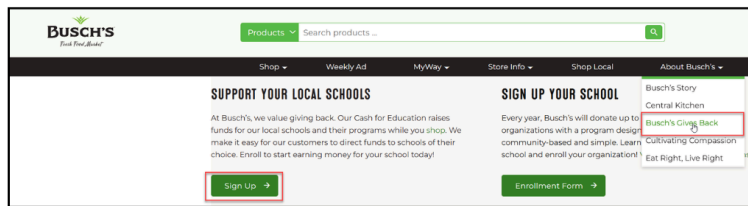

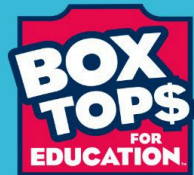
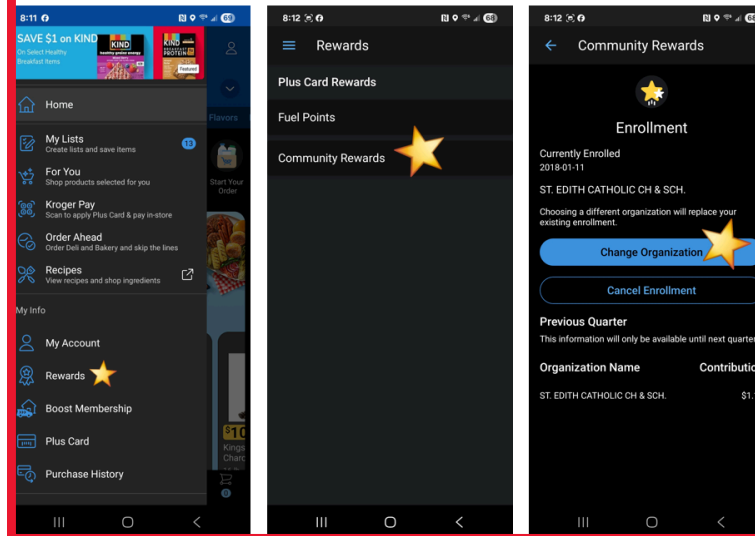
