This Week with Mrs. Kelly

Kinders, 1st and 2nd grade continued to learn and practice how to handle big emotions that can arise when you're angry or when you make a mistake. One way for kids to handle big emotions is by using the "Calm Down Steps" which are: 1) Say "Stop"; 2) Name your feeling; 3) Use a calm down skill like belly breathing, counting or positive self-talk. Practice at home and at school will help the steps become second nature. K Prep worked on naming feelings, and I was proud of their thoughtful answers. Grade 4 wrapped up their unit on understanding others' points of view, and everyone learned something new about a classmate. Grade 5 did a deep dive on healthy vs. unhealthy friendships and made "friendship catchers."
