Lunch orders for May are due next Friday, April 24th. Lunch will be on this side of the building every day but Thursday, for the remainder, due to security. Next year, lunch will be on the school side of the building every day. I have been in contact with maintenance to ensure cleanliness as well as scheduling and space usage to guarantee our children are safe.

We don't need Needohs or squishies at school. Please keep them home!

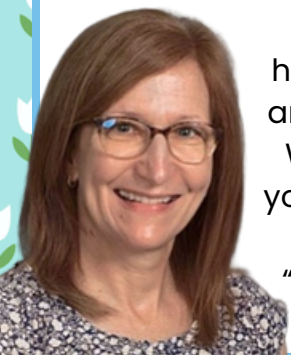
Please stay off the front grass and flower beds as the parish works to get our church spring ready!
