It was another busy week in SEL! K prep worked on handling anger and practiced deep breathing while blowing bubbles outside. Kinders started a new unit on problem solving using the STEP method: S = Say the problem; T = Think of solutions; E = Explore the outcomes; P = Pick a solution. 1st grade practiced using belly breathing for calming down and used it during our exciting game of "Hot Potato." 2nd grade discussed ways to manage anxious feelings and played "Hot Potato" while naming feeling words. 3rd & 4th grade spent time in nature using our senses to calm our minds and bodies. 5th grade identified problems in communities, brainstormed how people are impacted by them, then explored ways to make positive change. They are future leaders!

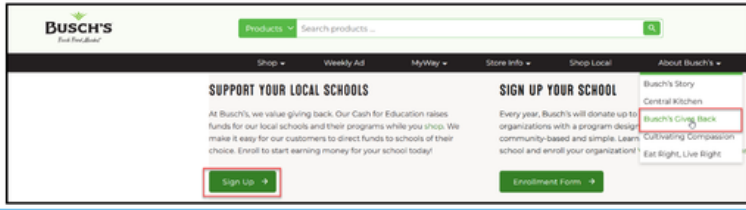

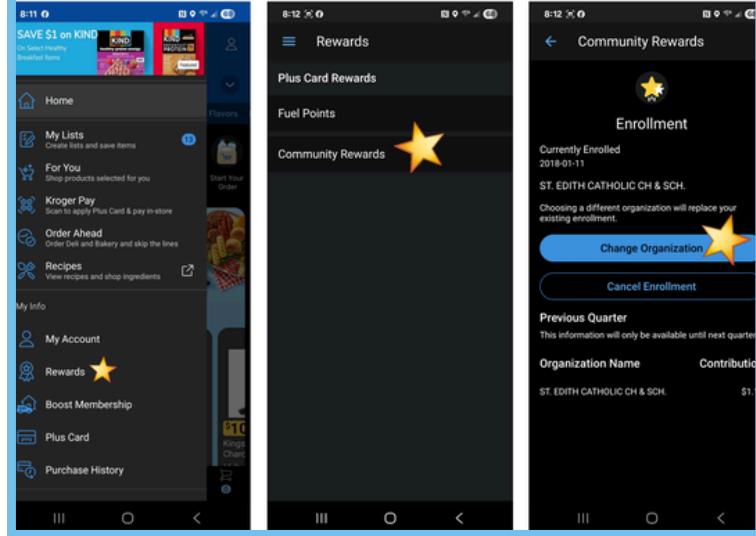
