Happy May! K Prep did a great job learning and practicing ways to wait. Kinders read "Miles McHale Tattletale" and learned the "Tattle Battle Pledge" which helps us decide when we need to tell the teacher something and when we can handle it on our own.

Grades 1 & 2 are working on expanding their feelings vocabulary. We can better explain how we feel when we know more words. They also brainstormed ways to handle when they're angry and when they're worried. Grade 4 focused on the first step of problem solving which is learning how to say the problem in a way that's respectful and doesn't blame anyone. 5th grade evaluated possible solutions to community problems by considering different points of view.

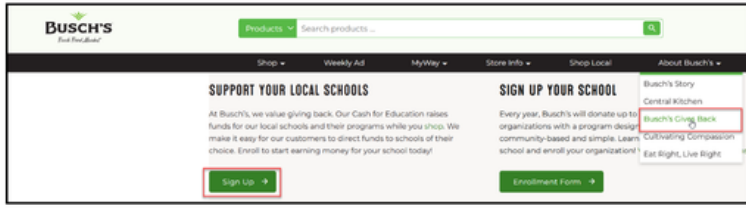

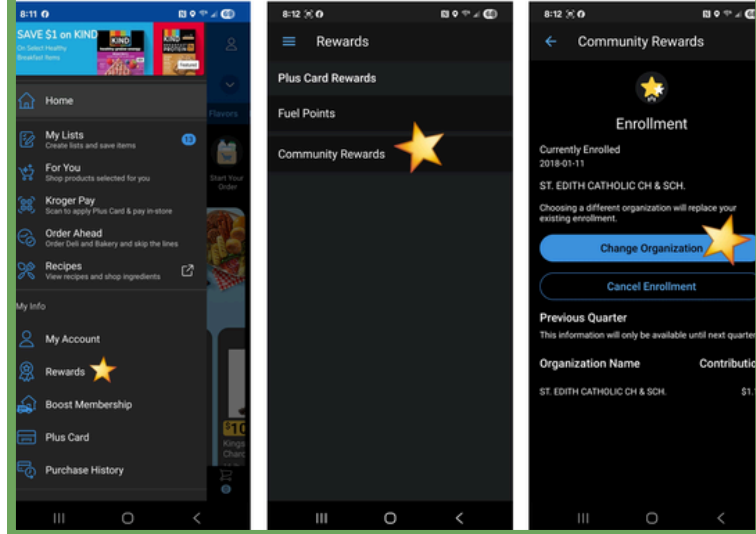
