I can't believe it's already the last week of SEL! K prep & 1st grade worked on learning ways to invite others to play. Kindergarten continued to build skills on when to tell the teacher something and when to handle it on their own. 2nd grade dove into taking responsibility for their actions and knowing when and how to apologize. 4th grade completed the final unit and capped it off with a challenging problem-solving exercise that each student was able to complete! 5th grade capped off the year with the "Marshmallow" challenge. Each small group was given 20 spaghetti noodles (uncooked!), string, tape, and a marshmallow and given 10 minutes to build the tallest tower. Successful groups listened to each other and took their time developing a plan.

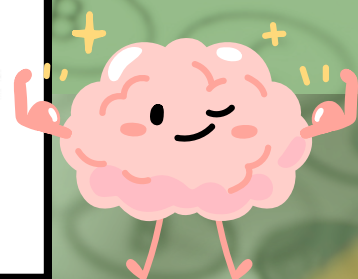
Glossary

Scaled Score: Ranges from 0-1400 and spans grades 1-12. It is calculated based on the difficulty of the questions and the number of correct responses. Scaled Score is useful for comparing student performance over time and across grades.

Grade Equivalent: Represents how a student's test performance compares with that of other students nationally. For example, if the GE is 5.2, that means this student scores the same as an average fifth grade in the second month, NOT that they can complete fifth-grade level material.

Percentile Rank: Scores range from 1-99 and express student ability relative to the scores of other students in the same grade nationally. For example, if the percentile rank is 75, the student's skills are greater than 75% of other children in the same grade that scored similarly nationwide.

Instructional Reading Level: A criterion-referenced score that is the highest reading level at which a student is 80% proficient or higher at comprehending material with assistance.






All kindergarten students take the STAR Early Literacy test in the fall and winter. Once students earn an 852 Scaled Score in Early Literacy, they then take the STAR Reading and STAR Math. The kindergarten reading and math scores are typically based off a handful of K students in the winter and more students in the spring (six for reading, 10 for math). If a student does not hit the 852 threshold in winter or spring, he/she takes STAR Early Literacy only.
